Background

- In 2023, Sydney Local Health District hosted a Sarcoma Summit at RPA Hospital
- The first event of its kind in Australia, the Summit focused on building a stronger understanding between patients, families, researchers and clinicians and enhancing partnerships to improve patient care
- Key themes from the Summit included:
 - Service enhancement including access to services outside of normal hours & time with patients
 - Access to information / education
 - Support for patients, families and friends
